

**Exhibit Check-In: Monday, August 8, 2011 from 3-6pm at Hazel Ruby Community Building**

**Pick-Up: Sunday, August 14, 2011 from 10am-12pm at Hazel Ruby Community Building**

**Rules**

1. All products shown in this department must be 2011 grown unless otherwise specified, and must have been grown by the exhibitor on his/her farm or garden.
2. **Exhibits that do not conform to rules will be disqualified.**
3. Articles improperly classified will not be judged.
4. When there is no competition a ribbon may be given (if worthy). If in a class no exhibits are worthy, ribbons will not be awarded. The decision of the judges is final.
5. Fair officials will take every precaution for the safekeeping of exhibits after their arrival and arrangement in the building, but will not be responsible for any damage or loss that may occur.
6. Entry tags will be attached to exhibit upon arrival on grounds, when applicable.
7. **Each exhibitor is limited to ONE (1) entry per class, except where noted.**
8. Exhibits showing excessive spray residue may be downgraded. No wax or oil may be applied to any exhibit.

**Section 1 — CORN**

**In Stalk Classes, stalk to be cut 6" above ground level.**

**PREMIUMS (Classes 1, 2, and 3)**

1st, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place

1. Field corn for ensilage, 5 stalks
2. Field corn for grain, 5 stalks
3. Field corn, husked, 10 ears. May be this year's or previous years crop.

**Section 2 — POTATOES**

Potatoes to be exhibited unwashed, but should have dirt brushed off of them.

All potato exhibits must be true to type.

**PREMIUMS (Classes 4 and 5)**

1st, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place

4. White Potatoes, 6
5. Red Potatoes, 6

**Section 3 — FORAGE CROPS**

All exhibits must be the equivalent of about one-fourth standard square bale taken from the middle of bona fide bale of hay.

No loose hay or uncured hay will be accepted.

**PREMIUMS (Classes 6, 7, 8 and 9)**

1st, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place

6. Alfalfa Hay (less than 10% grass)
7. Mixed legume hay (grass and alfalfa/clover)
8. First Cutting Grass Hay (less than 10% legume)
9. Aftermath Grass Hay (regrowth, less than 10% legume)

**Section 4 — VEGETABLES — FRESH**

**Must be grown by Exhibitor AND** all articles must be placed in water, where applicable, such as broccoli, kale, etc.

**PREMIUMS (Classes 48-53)**

1st, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place

- 49. Grapes, 3 bunches

**Section 7— MISCELLANEOUS**

**PREMIUMS (Classes 54-60)**

1st , 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place

- 54. Eggs, brown or white, 1 dozen
- 55. Herbs, fresh, 3 stalks (in jar with water)
- 56. Honey, 1 pint or quart jar
- 57. Oddity, 1 (crop normally grown in this area that shows odd characteristics)
- 58. Sunflower, 1
- 59. Unusual, 1 (crop not normally grown in this area)
- 60. Miscellaneous

**PREMIER PRODUCE EXHIBITOR** - The Premier Exhibitor will be determined by totaling the ribbon points for everyone entering **10 or more** exhibits (must enter in 10 or more categories). Points will be based on Blue-3, Red-2, and White-1. The total number of points will be divided by the total number of entries. The person with the highest average will be the Premier Exhibitor.
